Standard unit SOP coordinators and team leads are up on all the medical surgical units for round 2 of activity follows for 1 hour blocks documenting detailed activity by the nurses minute by minute. We are trying to understand how much time nurses spend on direct patient care. Each of these units have implemented model of care, with the goal of frontline staff spending more time at the patients bedside. Current observations will be compared to previous data to see how effective the changes were in reducing wasteful activities such as locating misplaced items or equipment. More time spent at the bedside means better outcomes for our patients. A special thank you to all staff who have participated in the activity follows.
