

We are pleased to announce that Care Rounds have arrived on 7/8N at the Met Campus this week! With the help of the interdisciplinary team, these boards will allow unit staff to report on barriers to discharge and collaborate on a daily plan of care tailored to support the patient's recovery, as well as timely discharge from hospital.

Patient Summary Tools and Shift to Shift reporting have also launched on 6E and 8W at the Ouellette Campus! The Patient Summary Tool is being updated throughout the patient's stay and is used as a reference sheet during verbal Shift to Shift report. For Shift to Shift report, the nursing staff meet in pre-determined modules and receive report for all patients within their set module, allowing for an increase in collaboration.
