Pathways reducing the length of time stroke patients are in the hospital

In June, teams started to trial the Pathway Bundles with patients having had an Ischemic Stroke. Since that time, over 50 patients and their families have benefits from receiving standardized care.

Since starting to use the Pathway Bundle, the number of days patients stay in acute care has reduced from over 6 days to less than 5 days. This means patients are waiting less time in an acute



care bed before moving on to their next steps in care. As result of the trial, the teams have learned what worked well and what could be improved. Changes have been made and teams are looking forward to launching the remaining 4 diagnosis this August. Stay tuned!

Sharing the benefits for patients: Standardizing processes in the Mental Health, Critical Care, and Emergency Department units

Since the middle of May, the second wave of Standard Unit teams from Mental Health, Critical Care and Emergency Departments have assembled their teams comprised of managers and frontline staff. LEAN Six Sigma Green Belt and Yellow Belt staff were also recruited to provide an outsider perspective and lead literature reviews to supplement best practices within the current Standard Unit Bundles.

Helen Catauro, Manager Corporate Quality Improvement/Decision Support joined the Critical Care team. "This process improvement journey will
