## 8E Launches Shift to Shift Report

The SOP Standard Unit Project Team has been working diligently alongside the staff on 8 East at the Ouellette Campus to help facilitate the official launch of the Shift to Shift report. The SOP Team and 8E management have been educating and collecting feedback from front line staff on the use of the Patient Summary Tool (PST) and associated tools for Shift to Shift report.



Based upon input received from front line staff, updates to the original Shift to Shift format have been made. To improve the reporting experience, 8E nursing staff suggested eliminating Shift to Shift report in a large group setting and move to decentralized, module-based groups. This change has allowed each nurse to better focus on patients in their assigned module and has reduced the overall report time by one third!

## Preparing for a 5S in the Fracture Clinic (Met Campus)

The Ambulatory Clinics - Fracture SOP Project Team will conduct a walkthrough to look for opportunities to align their physical layout with their new process. The information gathered from this walkthrough will help the team determine their plan for an upcoming 5S next month. The project team has also completed spaghetti diagrams to identify waste such as excess physician and patient motion. Team members hope to decrease the amount of time it takes to treat a patient by having most of the materials needed at the bedside.

Every Friday at 1100h & 1300h (excluding holidays), the SOP project teams, management and executive leadership come to hear about the progress of each of the projects in the SOP offices at Ouellette and Met Campuses.
