## Preassessment Streamlines for Patients


As of Monday, October 17, patients that are pre-assessed for surgery at the Ouellette campus no longer need to return for a second visit if they require an internal medicine consult. The inclusion of internal medicine physicians is the latest addition to the Ouellette Pre-Assessment clinic, as the Joint Clinic was integrated in April 2016. The Met site has been including internal medicine consults since before the project started. "We have created a single appointment for the patients coming for a Pre Surgical Screening visit," says Shannon Sampson, Manager of Day Surgery and Outpatient Clinics, "with the addition of internal medicine, we have combined what used to be three visits into one." The team is most excited that the data for the first week shows that the addition of internal medicine has not had a negative effect on wait times or appointment length. In fact, patients waited less than normal on the first day of internal medicine appointments. Patient wait times and total appointment

length will continue to be measured, along with overall patient satisfaction. Congratulations to the Pre-Assessment
