


Figure 3 - Percentage of tests positive in Canada compared to previous seasons, week 2022-35 to 2022-49





Met - 92% (medicine, surgery & critical care) 11 (admit no bed) ANB Paeds at 16/16 (4 respiratory, mix of RSV, Influenza) NICU at 13/22 ICU at 9/19

Ouellette - 92 % (medicine, surgery & critical care) **17 ANB** ICU 15/20, CCU 10/12

FLASHBACK – September 2022 – 33 ALC for LTC and a combined 913 days. Average 27 days per ALC for LTC.






Care. In total all 19 have been ALC for LTC 377 days. Average



ou have worsening respiratory illness symptoms and any of the following apply to you:

- You are at higher risk of getting seriously ill from COVID-19 and need to get tested and assessed for COVID-19 treatment (check eligibility)
- You have been directed to visit a COVID-19 clinical assessment centre by your primary care provider
- You feel that you cannot safely monitor your COVID-19 symptoms at home and need to be seen by a health care provide

You do not need to have a positive test result to visit. You should bring a list of your medications and a list of any important medical conditions

If you develop severe symptoms requiring medical attention, such as shortness of breath, chest pain, loss of consciousness, or confusion, call 911 or go to the emergency department.

Please bring the most recent list of all your medications with you when attending the Quellette Clinical Assessment Center in case the practitioner needs to review them with you

Volumes Seen in Clinic:

- Between 40-70 patients per day, varies by day of week
- Majority are those attending requiring testing only per the eligibility criteria
- 1 5 patients per day eligible and treated with Remdesivir or Paxlovid
- Approximately 20 patients per day seeking clinical assessment under updated criteria
- Of those 20 approximately 5-6 on average are children
