1. CALL TO ORDER:

The meeting was called to order at 1700 hours with Mr. Lachance presiding as Chair (in Mr. McLeod's absence) and Ms. Sutherland recording the minutes.

2. DECLARATIONS OF CONFLICT OF INTEREST:

None declared.

3. PREVIOUS MINUTES:

The minutes of the October 2, 2025, Board meeting had been previously circulated.

MOVED by Ms. L. Staudt, **SECONDED** by Ms. G. Isshak and **CARRIED THAT** the minutes of the October 2, 2025, Board of Directors meeting be approved.

4. REPORT FROM THE PRESIDENT & CEO / CNE

Ms. Riddell reported. Highlights are outlined below.

We held our quarterly Town Hall on October 23rd. The NWEACH project team presented an overview of the work completed to date for the new hospital planning and provided an opportunity for questions. There was great engagement with over 100 people in attendance.

The Nurse Police Team (NPT) program received a \$500,000 grant from the government. This will enable the NPT to continue providing on-scene treatment to those in need. The NPT program has attracted attention across North America, mainly due to its operational success.

The Windsor Regional Hospital Foundation would like to thank the Funkenhauser Family for their most recent donation of \$13,300 from funds raised from the annual 'Trevor Louis Funkenhauser - A Day For A Life' golf tournament, in honour of Gunther and Judy's son, Trevor, who passed away tragically in 2006 following a courageous battle against endocarditis.

WRH was thrilled to announce the grand opening of the newly renovated 4West Atrium-renamed the Stephanie and Barry Zekelman Atrium, designed specifically for patients and their families. The revitalization of this area was made possible through the generous contribution of \$100,000 from Transition 2 Betterness (T2B) and their incredible donors, including the Stephanie and Barry Zekelman Foundation. The atrium welcomes visitors daily from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m., offering a peaceful retreat for patients and their families to relax and socialize away from their rooms during their stay.

We were also honored to celebrate the 6th annual Sail into Summer Cheque Presentation in the amount of \$80,000. This year's event helped purchase a state-of-the-art Hemo Cardiovascular Information System, which will be part of the newly renovated Cardiac Catheterization Lab at the Ouellette Campus of Windsor Regional Hospital

Our Carve 4 Cancer event raised over \$16,000 for a grand total raised of \$93,408 since 2018 for the Windsor Regional Cancer Centre.

The Redevelopment Team and WRH User Group Members have been working closely with the experienced planners at Stantec Architecture and Agnew Peckham on a set of rules and requirements for the new build, along with early and illustrative drawings — both key components of the eventual Request for Proposals (RFP) used as part of a competitive procurement process to determine who will deliver the project. The project team is also making strong progress in the corporate renaming and rebranding engagement initiative. Since launching the engagement survey in September — which is now available in 10 target languages on the project website - more than 1,450 survey responses have been completed.

Ms. Krywionek provided an IPAC update. WRH currently has six COVID cases, one influenza case and one RSV-a paediatric case. WRH continues to monitor trends closely using the Ontario Respiratory Virus tool. We kicked off our staff flu vaccine clinics in October. This is a collaborative effort between our Pharmacy team and Employee Health.

WRH is proud to announce the successful transition of our Gestational Diabetes Program to the Windsor-Essex Community Health Centre (WE-CHC), now offered through their Diabetes Wellness Clinic. This move enhances accessibility for expectant mothers across our region, ensuring they receive high-quality, community-based care from expert nurses and dietitians.

The new DI careers page is now live launching just in time for MRT Week to support recruitment outreach. Recruitment in DI continues to present some challenges, consistent with broader trends across the sector. We'll be promoting it on social media to help raise awareness of our DI opportunities and incentive programs.

5. REPORT FROM SCHULICH:

Dr. Jacobs' report included some very positive metrics on recruitment:

6. FINANCIAL PRESENTATION (September 30, 2025, Results):

Mr. Lanoue reported.

Slide 2 – Financial Results – YTD September 2025

- The net deficit after building amortization is \$15,156,000 which is \$1,252,000 better than budget
- We expect some catch-up on building amortization with capitalization of the LINAC project
- Hospital Margin is negative \$11,326,000 which is \$662,000 better than plan

Slide 3 – Significant Variances

Chart indicates expense variances and the offsetting revenue:

- Salaries and Benefits continue to trend positively and in a combined surplus of \$1,457,000
- Medical Staff Fees \$1,164,000 deficit
 - \$1,017,000 in offsetting funding (Emergency & NICU Alternate Funding) and patient services revenue for diagnostic services
- Medical/Surgical Supplies had a surplus of \$627,000 mainly in the perioperative program with lower than planned volumes
- Drugs \$470,000 surplus
- Other Supplies \$1,074,000 deficit no offsetting revenue
 - Pressure points: building and equipment maintenance, patient transportation, contrast media and physician recruitment costs

Slide 4 – Sick and Overtime Benchmarks

Metric is Sick/Overtime Hours as a Percentage of Total Worked Hours

For the *month* of September – unionized staff

• Sick Percentage at both Campuses is above the target of 4.8% with Met at 6.1% and Ouellette at 6.2%

• Overtime Percentage at Met Campus is 4.3% and Ouellette is 7.0% versus the target of 4.0%.

Slide 5 – Sick and Overtime Benchmarks

For the *month* of August – non-union staff

- Sick Percentage is 1.0% below the target of 2.2%
- Overtime Percentage is 0.0% which is the target (non-union overtime is extremely rare)





Sick & Overtime Benchmarking (Union) October 31, 2025






Sick Target 4.8%

4.1 Minutes of Previous Meeting – Monday, October 27, 2025

The Finance/Audit & Resources Committee Minutes of the **General** Meeting of **Monday, October 27, 2025** was previously circulated to all members.

5.0 BUSINESS ARISING FROM PREVIOUS MEETING

5.1 <u>Ouellette Campus Sicktime Increase vs. Decrease in Overtime</u>

Mr. Bested reported that the committee will see a similar trend in this month's financial report as in the prior month. Normally, sicktime and overtime is fairly linear; a further decline is seen at both sites this month in terms of the overtime pay versus sicktime.

Discussions internally have been held and focus has been on how the hospital is replacing staff when a sick-call is received. In looking at the summer months, June, July and August, there is much vacation time and the hospital utilizes the part-time staff to fill in for vacation. Subsequently, when there is a sick call, it may be because the hospital has utilized the part-time staff beyond their part-time hours. These are typically "overtime replacement calls" which the hospital begins to see in the months of October, November and December periods. There is the ability through the collective agreements that part-time staff are the first to call which would be on straight time and this mitigates the overtime spend when there are sick calls.

Mr. Bested indicated that he and Mrs. Gauthier reviewed the last fiscal year and a similar trend is seen beyond October, November and December and there is a similar decline, although not as dramatic as this year. The hospital expects this to trend throughout December as well.

No questions were posed by the committee members.

6.0 NEW BUSINESS / FOR DISCUSSION

6.1 Monthly Operating Results Report – October 31, 2025 (As Appended)

Ms. Zimmer provided the following highlights:

- Seven months ended October 31, 2025, the deficit after net building amortization amounts to \$16,475,000 (which is \$1,459,000 better than plan).

- Represents a negative Ministry of Health Margin of \$11,420,000; one year ago, margin was negative \$17,121,000.
- Some of the major variances include:
 - Surplus in salary and wages, although declined slightly in percentage compared to previous year-to-date.
 - Large surplus in benefits which is due to a surplus distribution from WSIB based on fund balances and favourable investment returns. Surplus amounts to \$1,777,000.
 - Medical staff fees have the same drivers as in the prior month \$1,600,000 deficit (offsetting funding from Emergency and NICU Alternate Funding).
 - Medical/Surgical Supplies in surplus position, although a decline upon comparison to September year-to-date as a result of an increase in operating room cases.
 - Variance in drugs has increased compared to previous months due to good work being done with the expired and wasted drugs and general surpluses in areas where volumes are slightly lower than expected.
 - Other supplies variance \$1,456,000 no offsetting revenue.




