



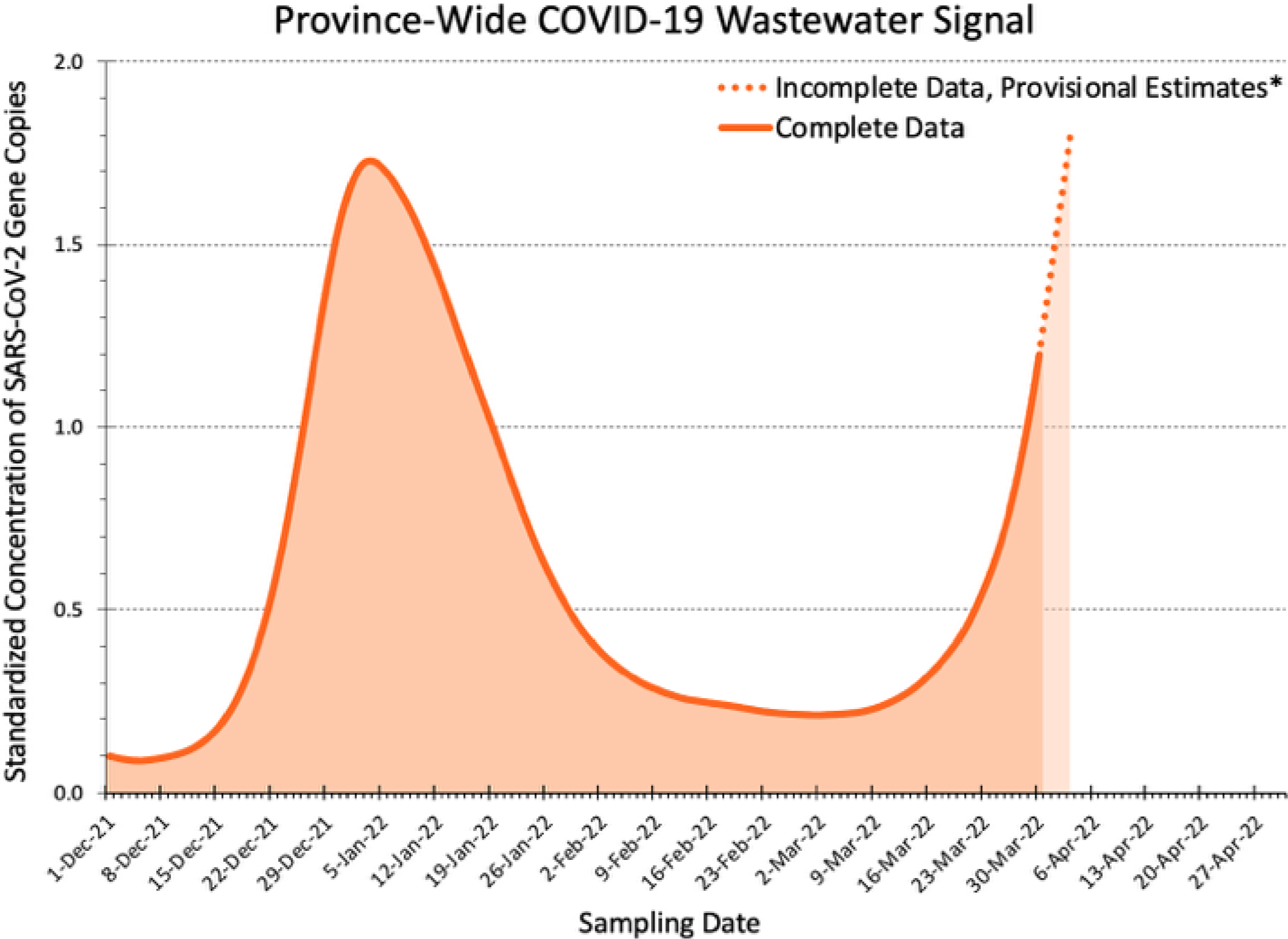

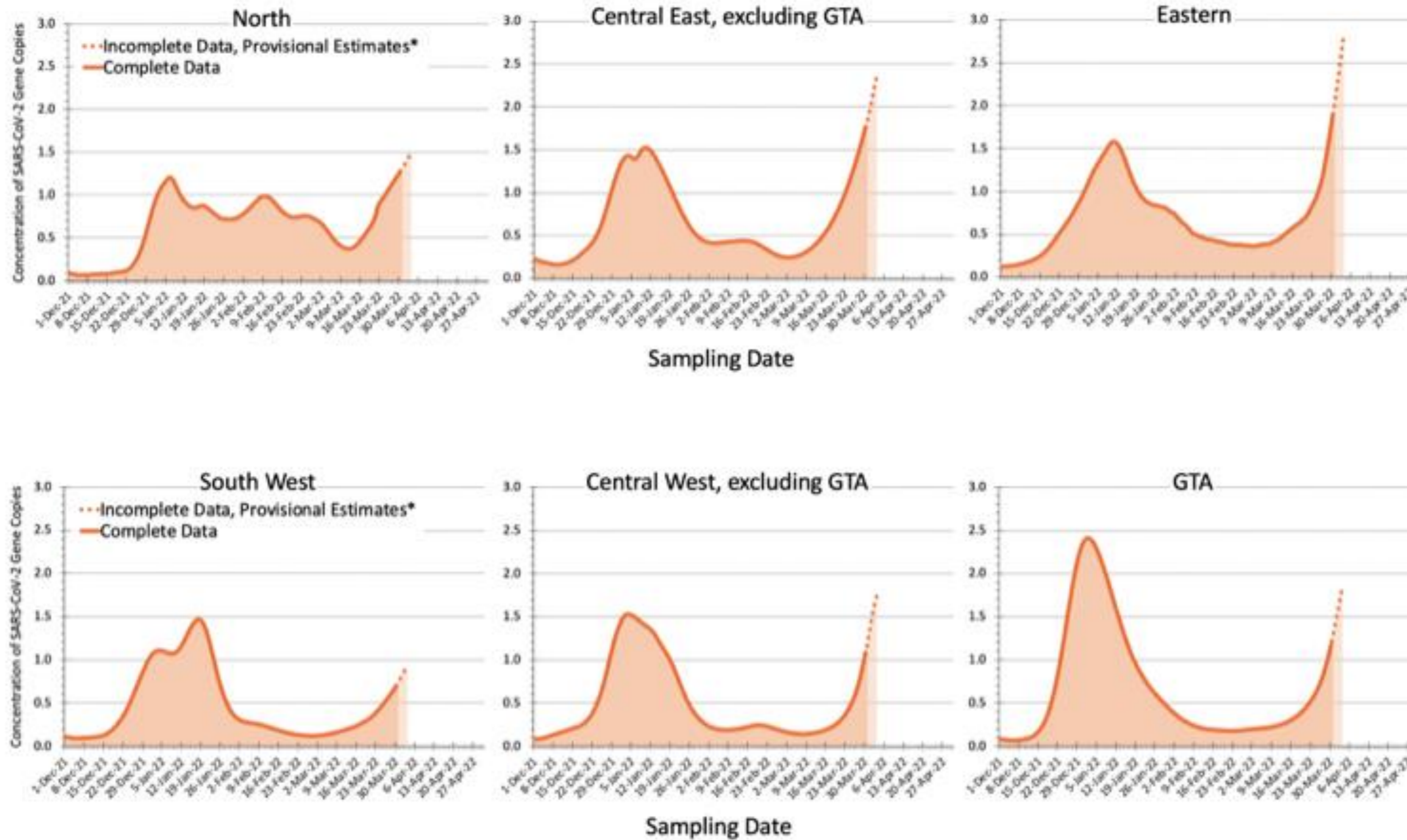

Provincial COVID-19 Wastewater Statistics – By Region

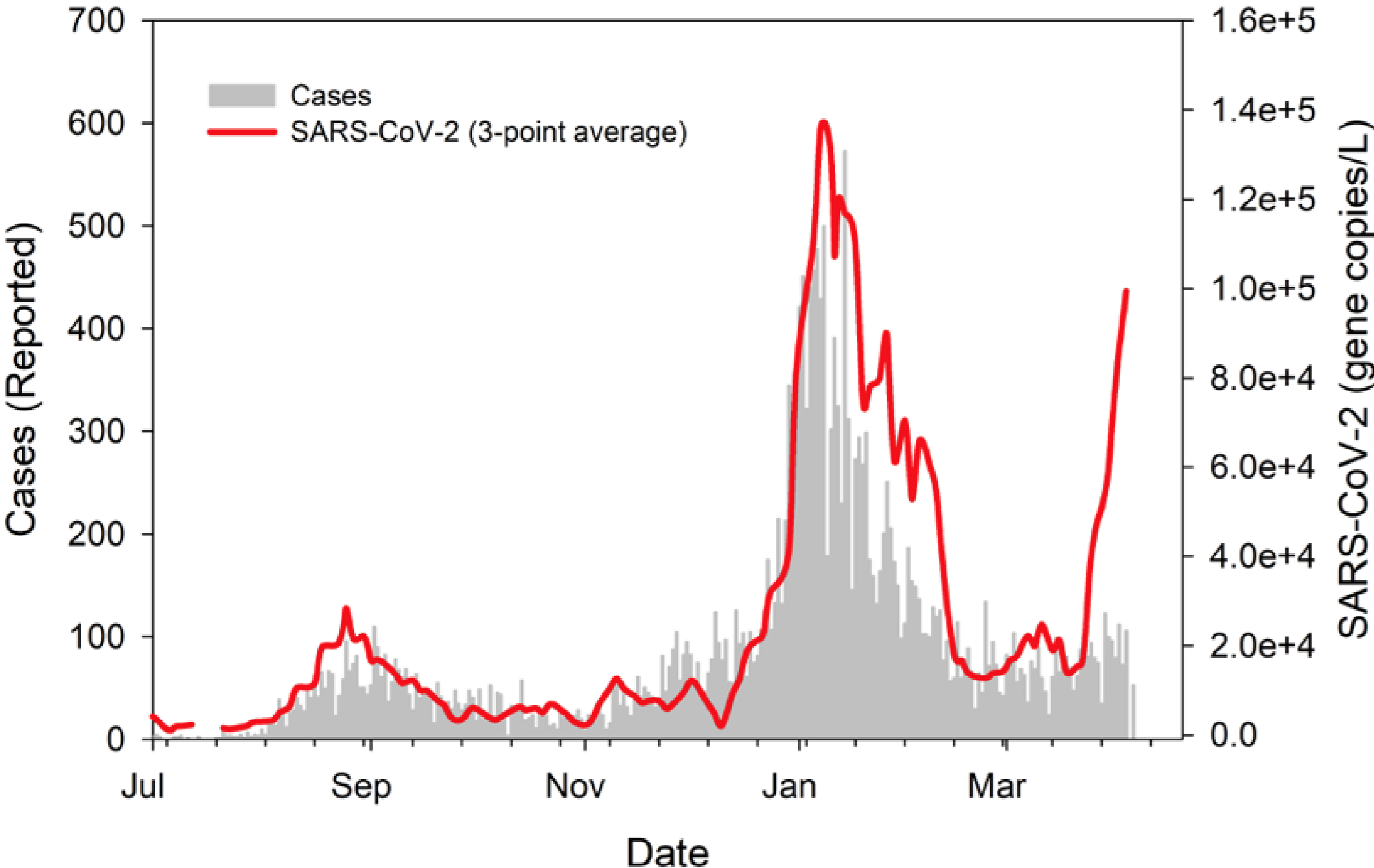

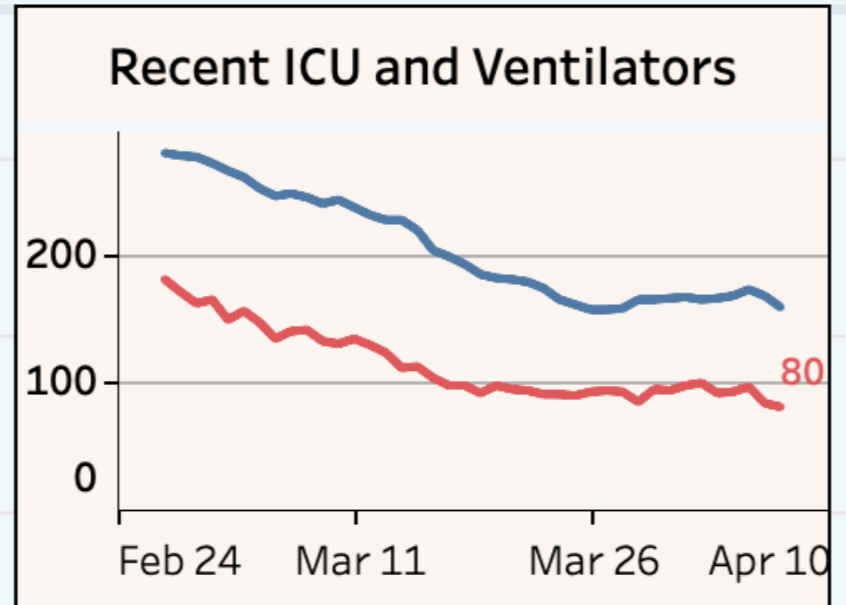
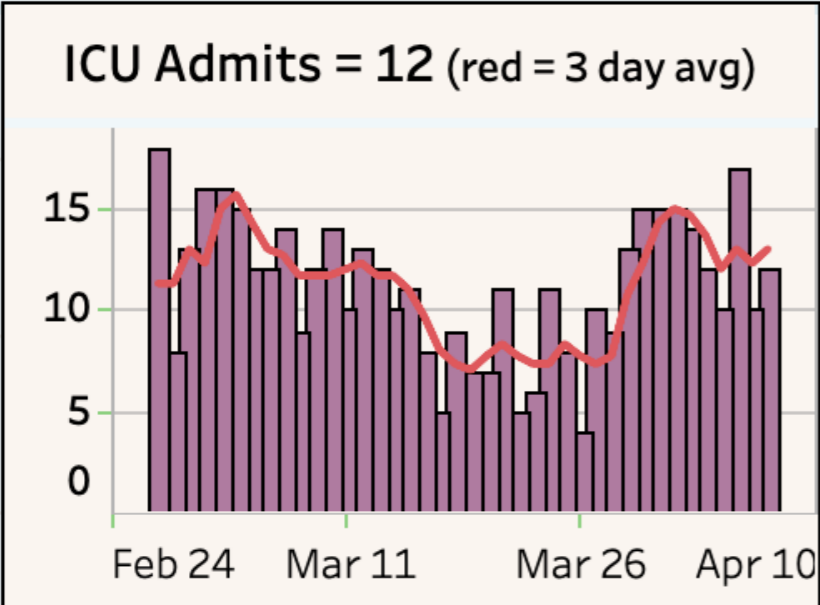
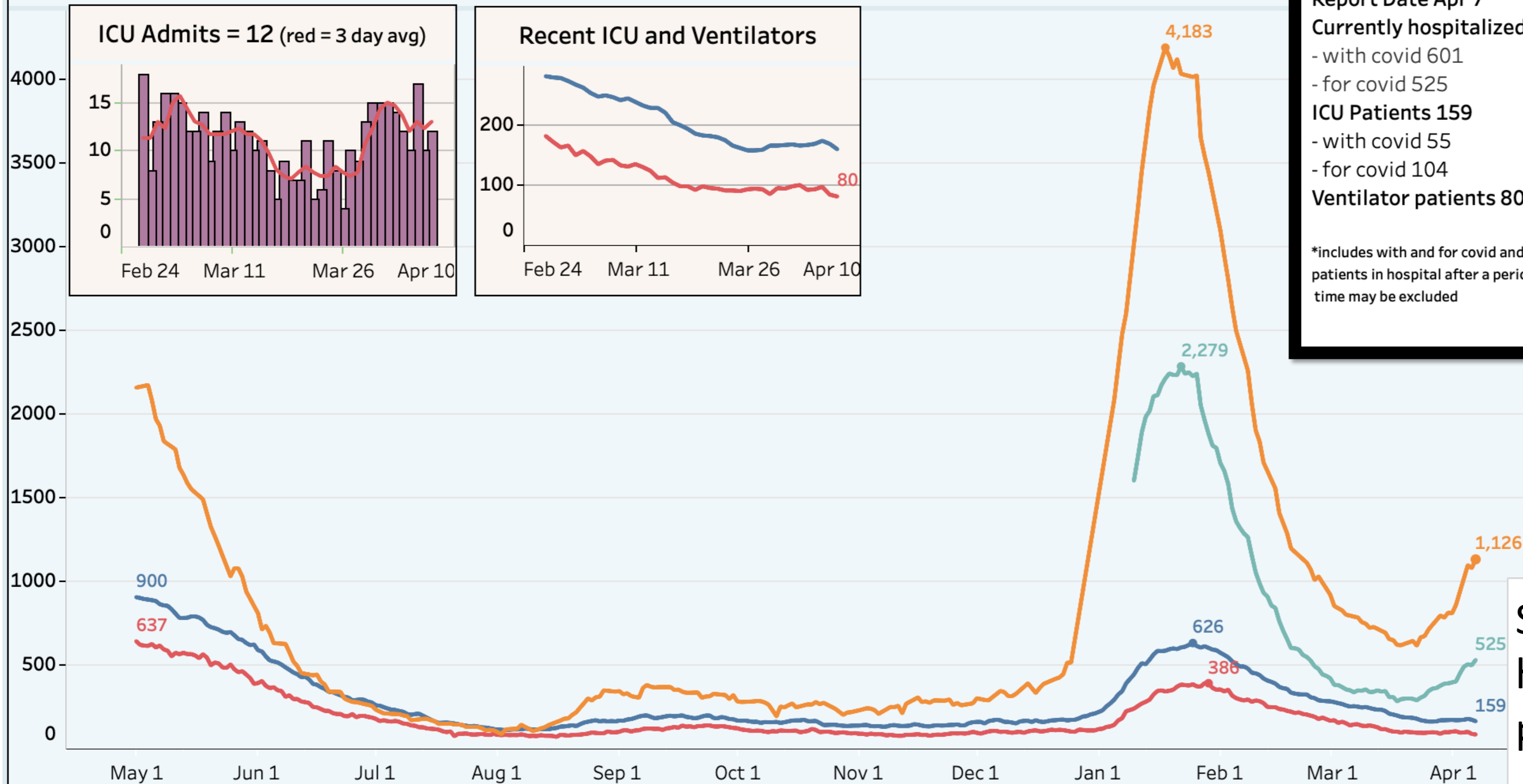
Provincial COVID-19 Hospitalization Rates

Ontario Hospitalizations and ICU Reported Apr 07 2022

- Hospitalizations* **1,126** ↑319 (+39.5%) vs last week
- ICU Patients **159** ↓7 (-4.2%) vs last week Ventilators **80** (-14.0%) ↓13 vs last week
- New Adult ICU Admissions **12** ↓3 vs last week
- *estimated for Sun/Mon. 46.6% hospitalized for covid, remainder for other conditions with covid

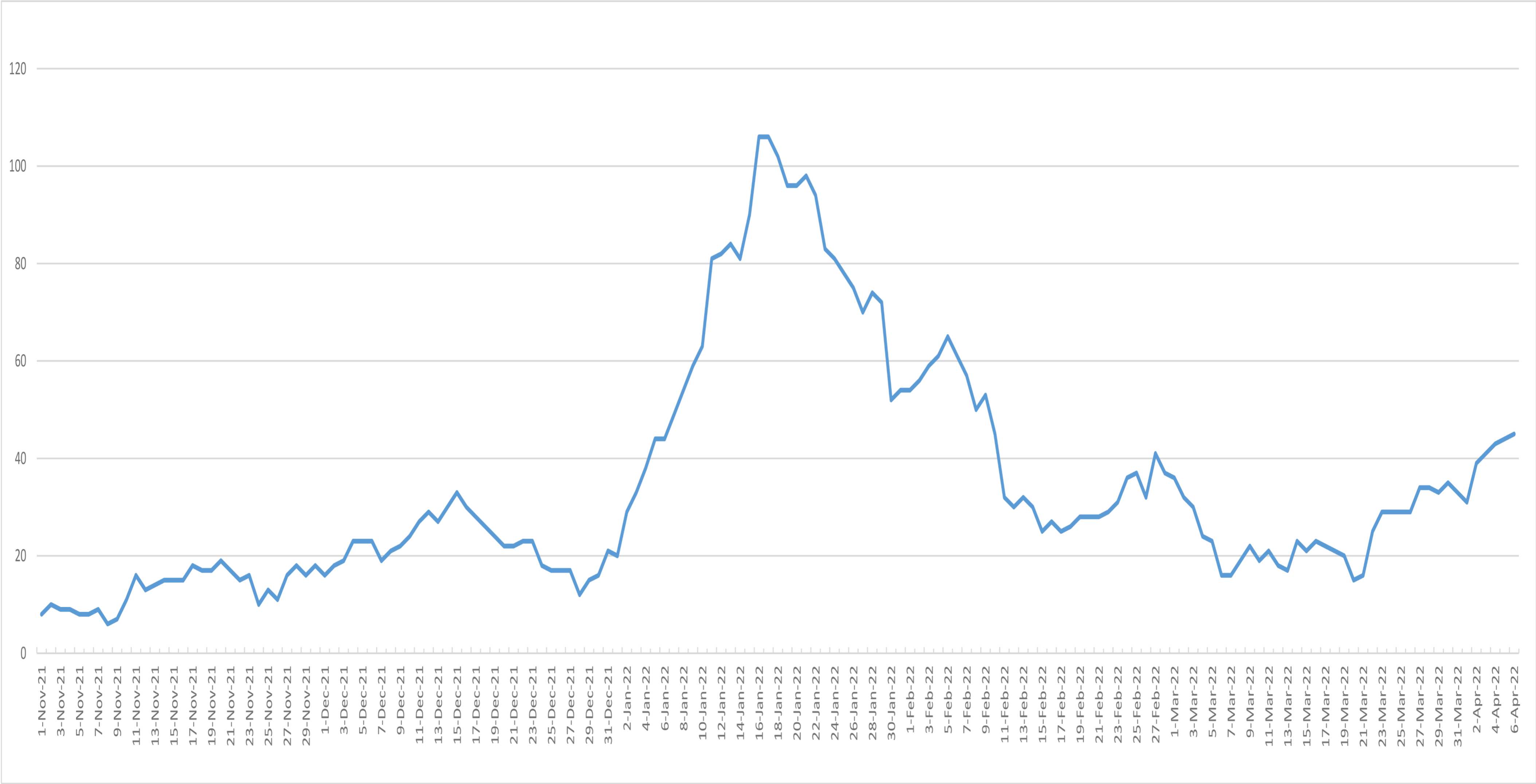



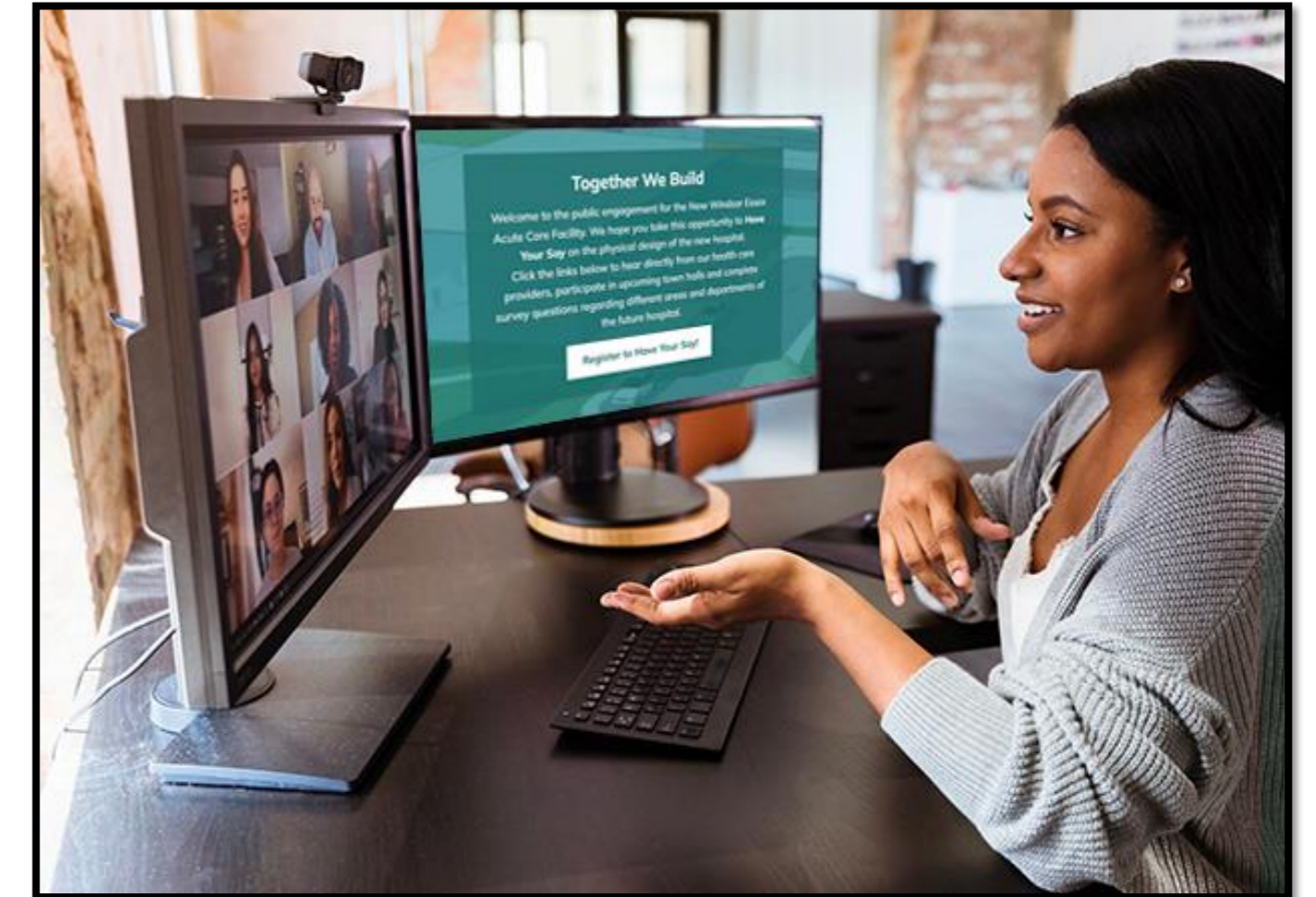

Together We Build By the Numbers

- 2520+ people have visited the site since it launched
- 11 town halls held 344 people have attended and they have received 480 views on Youtube.
- 45 members of the planning team and User Groups have participated in the town halls, including 12 patient representatives.
- 100 questions have been answered through the town halls and another 19 on the project site.
- 240 Surveys have been completed and 46 ideas shared on the engagement platform.
