Extern Program- Ongoing Funding

The Met Campus CAC now located in the Paediatric Outpatient Dept at Met Campus- focuses on care of patients aged 3 months to 17 years. Since opening in August of 2021 we have seen over 8500 patients. The **Ouellette Campus AC located adjacent to the Emergency Department has seen over 140,000 patients since** March 2020.

Criteria for Testing: You are eligible for PCR or rapid POC molecular testing if you have COVID-19 symptoms and are any of the following- from https://covid-19.ontario.ca/covid-19-clinical-assessments-andtesting#who-is-eligible-for-pcr-or-rapid-poc-molecular-testing

- settings, home or community care, demonstration school
- someone who lives with a patient-facing health care worker and/or a worker in the highest risk settings
- an outpatient being considered for COVID-19 treatment, or requiring diagnostic test for clinical management
- an outpatient who requires a diagnostic test for clinical management
- a temporary foreign worker living in a congregate setting
- underhoused or experiencing homelessness
- pregnant
- a first responder, including firefighters, police and paramedics
- school



a patient-facing health care worker, staff member, volunteer, resident, inpatient, essential care providers in high risk

an elementary or secondary student or education staff who has received a PCR self-collection kit, if available through your

other individuals as directed by the local public health unit based on outbreak investigations in high risk settings, etc.

COVID 19 Assessment and Testing

Whether you have symptoms or not, you are eligible for PCR or rapid POC molecular testing if you:

- are an individual from a First Nation, Inuit, Métis community, and/or who self-identifies as First Nation, Inuit, and Métis and their household members
- are an individual travelling into First Nation, Inuit, Métis communities for work
- are being admitted or transferred to or from a hospital or congregate living setting \bullet
- are a close contact of someone in a confirmed or suspected outbreak in a highest risk setting, or \bullet other settings as directed by the local public health unit
- have written prior approval for out-of-country medical services from the General Manager of OHIP or are a caregiver for someone who does
- are in a hospital, long-term care, retirement home or other congregate living setting, as directed lacksquareby public health units, provincial guidance or other directives



COVID 19 Treatment

WRH began offering Monoclonal Antibody and Paxlovid treatment in January of this year and have provided 49 Mab and 19 Paxlovid courses.

In addition to screening you at time of testing for treatment, you can self assess to see if you fall under any of the categories below and may qualify for either Monoclonal Antibody Treatment or Antiviral Treatment for COVID-19. If you think you qualify, please book a Clinical Assessment appointment at the Ouellette Campus COVID-19 Assessment Centre and bring a list of medications and a list of your current medical conditions. You may be required to take a COVID-19 test during your appointment to determine eligibility.

Patients may be considered at higher risk for severe outcomes from COVID-19 infection and may be eligible for treatment if they: are immunocompromised (have an immune system that is weakened by a health condition or medications) are unvaccinated or partially vaccinated (have received only one or two doses of a vaccine) have one or more risk factors, such as a long-term medical condition or being of older age are Indigenous, Black, or a member of another racialized community \bullet

Patients who may be at higher risk should contact a health care professional to be assessed as soon as possible.

COVID 19 Vaccination Recommendations/Eligibility

Children Aged 5 to 11 Recommended:

A two-dose primary vaccine series (second dose 8 weeks after first dose) A third dose is not currently recommended (exceptions apply for immunocompromised individuals).

Individuals Aged 12 to 59 Recommended:

A two-dose primary vaccine series (second dose 8 weeks after first dose) A third dose 6 months (168 days) after your second dose (if aged 12 to 17) or 3 months (84 days) after your second dose (if aged 18 or older). A fourth dose is recommended for First Nation, Inuit and Métis individuals and their non-indigenous household members aged 18 or older 5 months (140 days) after receiving the third dose.





Individuals Aged 60 or Older

Recommended:

A two-dose primary vaccine series (second dose 8 weeks after first dose).

A third dose 3 months (84 days) after your second dose.

A fourth dose 5 months (140 days) after your third dose. New effective 4-7-22



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
