


Canada Snapshot – Influenza November 20, 2022 to November 26, 2022 (Week 47)




Figure 3 - Percentage of tests positive in Canada compared to previous seasons, week 2022-35 to 2022-47


Includes CEDIS complaints: Shortness of breath, respiratory arrest, cough/congestion hyperventilation, stridor, wheezing, apneic spells

Met - 102%,

- 6 (admit no bed) ANB
- Paeds at 15/16 (11 respiratory, mix of RSV, Influenza)
- NICU at 16/22
- ICU at 12/19
- One 5 yr old in ICU RSV

Ouellette - 103 %

- 12 ANB
- ICU 15/20, CCU currently full

WRH Snapshot – Current Occupancy – ANB and ALC for LTC



ALC for LTC

As of 10AM – 21 Alternative Level of Care for Long Term Care. In total all 21 have been ALC for LTC 281 days. Average 13 days per ALC for LTC.

FLASHBACK – September 2022 – 33 ALC for LTC and a combined 913 days. Average 28 days per ALC for LTC.



On November 21st WRH was authorized to update the guidance for its COVID-19 Assessment Centre to expand access for:

- Both Adult and Paediatric patients experiencing
 - All respiratory illnesses including COVID-19, Influenza, RSV
- Recommended to seek care at your primary care provider first

Children with symptoms such as difficulty breathing, excessive vomiting, change in the level of consciousness, lacerations, or broken bones should still call 911 or go to the Emergency Department

Adults with severe symptoms such as shortness of breath, chest pain, loss of consciousness, or confusion, call 911 or go to the emergency department.



Services and Hours of Operation at the Clinic include:

- COVID-19 testing for eligible patients
- Clinical Assessment for respiratory illness
- Clinical Treatment for COVID-19 Remdesivir and Paxlovid
- Physicians on site
- Appointments required
- Same day appointments available
- Hours 9 am to 3 pm 7 days per week including holidays







Volumes Seen in Clinic:

- Between 50-100 patients per day, varies by day of week
- Majority are those attending requiring testing only per the eligibility criteria
- 1 4 patients per day eligible and treated with Remdesivir or Paxlovid
- Approximately 20 patients per day seeking clinical assessment under updated criteria
- Of those 20 approximately 14 on average are children
