1. CALL TO ORDER:

The meeting was called to order at 1700 hours with Mr. McLeod presiding as Chair and Ms. Sutherland recording the minutes.

2. DECLARATIONS OF CONFLICT OF INTEREST:

3. PREVIOUS MINUTES:

The minutes of the September 4, 2025 Board meeting had been previously circulated.

4. REPORT FROM THE PRESIDENT & CEO / CNE

Ms. Riddell referred to her written report and provided the following highlights.

Ms. Riddell introduced Ms. Kelly Heron who has recently been appointed as Vice President of Women's and Children's, Inpatient Surgery, Peri-Operative and Ambulatory Surgical Services. Ms. Heron will be working closely with Rosemary Petrakos, the current VP of the portfolio to ensure a smooth transition over the coming months.

Congratulations to Nicole Krywionek as the successful candidate for the position of Chief Nursing Executive and Vice President, Critical Care, Cardiology, Diagnostic Imaging, Respiratory Therapy, Patient Relations, Corporate Education and Training and Professional Practice.

The WRH Ouellette Campus celebrated zero harm events for the week of August 25, 2025. Congratulations to the team! The Patient Harm Index measures the number of preventable harm incidents that occur in the organization.

The National Day for Truth and Reconciliation, originally and still colloquially known as Orange Shirt Day, is a Canadian day of memorial to recognize the atrocities and multigenerational effects of the Canadian Indian residential school system. On Friday Sept 26th, we gathered to honour the children who never returned home from Residential Schools, survivors of Residential Schools, their families and communities with a Sacred Fire. This gathering involved a traditional opening, lighting of the sacred fire, teachings on the Sacred Fire and moments of personal reflection. In addition, on Tuesday, September 30th, we hosted a traditional dance and smudge ceremony to commemorate the day in the spirit of reconciliation in the Ouellette Campus Courtyard at 11:00 a.m.

Last week, the Corvette Club of Windsor drove their beautiful corvettes to the Met Campus and presented a very generous donation to our Paediatric Oncology Program of \$40,000. This brings their total donations to the POGO Satellite Unit to \$140,000.

WRH celebrated Franco-Ontario Day on September 25th. The day marked the 50th anniversary of the first raising of the Franco-Ontarian flag on September 25, 1975.

WRH's Corporate Renaming and Rebranding is off to a strong start. We have launched a renaming and rebranding survey inviting all staff, patients and community members to complete and have their say. Within the first week, more than 1000 participants have provided their input. The survey will remain open until December 15, 2025. It is currently available in French and English on the project website, with additional translations coming soon. Paper copies of the online surveys are also available through the hospital's redevelopment office. Additional direct engagement opportunities are being planned throughout Windsor-Essex. Future in-person opportunities will be published on the project website, shared through the hospital's social media channels and by email with those subscribed to the project email list.

The Chair welcomed and congratulated Ms. Krywionek and Ms. Heron on their new roles.

6. FINANCIAL PRESENTATION (August 31, 2025 Results):

Mr. Lanoue reported.

Slide 2 – Financial Results – YTD August 2025

- The net deficit after building amortization is \$13,934,000 which is \$554,000 better than budget
- Hospital Margin is negative \$10,735,000 which is \$60,000 better than plan

Slide 3 – Significant Variances

Chart indicates expense variances and the offsetting revenue:

- Salaries and Benefits have improved and are in a combined surplus of \$1,172,000
- Medical Staff Fees \$1,132,000 deficit
 - \$1,030,000 in offsetting funding (Emergency & NICU Alternate Funding) and patient services revenue for diagnostic services
- Medical/Surgical Supplies had a surplus of \$361,000 mainly in the perioperative program with lower than planned volumes
- Drugs \$447,000 surplus
 - o Pharmacy efficiency initiative to reduce expired and wasted drugs has resulted in these expenses being under budget by \$103,000 to date
- Other Supplies \$1,093,000 deficit no offsetting revenue
 - Pressure points: electricity, building and equipment maintenance, patient transportation and physician recruitment costs

Slide 4 – Sick and Overtime Benchmarks

Metric is Sick/Overtime Hours as a Percentage of Total Worked Hours

For the *month* of August – unionized staff

- Sick Percentage at both Campuses is above the target of 4.8% with Met at 6.1% and Ouellette at 5.5%
- Overtime Percentage at Met Campus is 5.1% and Ouellette is 7.8% versus the target of 4.0%.

Slide 5 – Sick and Overtime Benchmarks

For the *month* of August – non-union staff

- Sick Percentage is 0.8% well below the target of 2.2%
- Overtime Percentage is 0.0% which is the target (non-union overtime is extremely rare)










Sick Target 4.8%

4.1 Minutes of Previous Meeting – Monday, September 22, 2025

5.0 NEW BUSINESS / FOR DISCUSSION

5.1 Monthly Operating Results Report – September 30, 2025 (As Appended)

Ms. Zimmer provided the following highlights:

- Six months ended September 30, 2025, the deficit after net building amortization amounts to \$15,156,000 (which is \$1,252,000 better than plan). Represents a negative Ministry of Health Margin of \$11,326,000 which is \$662,000 better than plan; one year ago, margin was negative \$10,837,000.
- Net building amortization is very favourable that is related to the timing of i.e. Linac project and the Cath Lab; trying to estimate when those projects will be complete and capitalized, although too early in the budget as they have not been capitalized yet. An adjustment will be done next month; will include an estimate to ensure that the unusual variance is not there.
- Significant variances, salaries and benefits maintaining the same trend from the prior month; surplus of \$1.4 million.
- Med fees are over budget; mostly offset by increased patient service revenue and additional funding in the emergency and ICU AFA funding.
- Med surg have maintained and increased variance to date, mainly due to some lower volumes in the peri-operative program drugs. Variance is slightly declined in terms of percentage; some adjustments were done to revenue this month (slight adjustment).
- Other supplies \$1,074,000 deficit; pressures remain the same, building service equipment, patient transportation, contrast media and DI and physician recruitment costs.
- Sicktime and overtime for unionized staff. Ouellette Campus sicktime is at 6.2% of worked hours and at Met Campus 6.1% which is above the target of 4.8%.
- Overtime is over the target by 4%; target at the Ouellette Campus at 7% and at Met Campus at 4%.
- Non-union very low sick time, sick target below 2.2% or well below and overtime percentage is 0% which is target.
- Volumes acute patient days are up slightly by 3% over prior year-to-date.

- Mental Health is down 11% and emergency inpatient days down 24% which is good. Outpatient volumes are up 3.5% and emergency visits up 3% over prior year.

 ${f Q}$ — Sicktime at Ouellette has increased, but yet overtime had gone down. Some explanation or logic? ${f A}$ — Mr. Bested indicated that he would need to look into this, possibly a "one-off".

1. Financial Results for the Six Months ended September 30, 2025 (Statement 2)

For the six months ended September 30, 2025, the deficit after net building amortization is \$15,156,000, which is \$1,252,000 better than plan. This represents a negative Ministry of Health Margin of \$11,326,000 (one year ago, the margin was negative \$10,837,000).

Revenue

Ministry revenue (combined base and one-time) is \$756,000 (0.3%) lower than budget.

Base funding is under budget \$832,000 due to amounts repayable to the Ministry for volume-based programs in cardiology, neurology, quality-based procedures and the renal program which total \$1,455,000. This shortfall is offset by a funding surplus in Emergency and NICU Alternate funding of \$623,000. One time funding is over budget by \$76,000 in the "Fee for Service" Ontario Breast Screening Program due to higher than planned volumes.

Ministry drug reimbursements have a negative variance of \$390,000 (1.6%). This revenue comes from the Cancer Centre's New Drug Funding program and the renal program. This budget is based on estimated drug usage and corresponding reimbursement and therefore there is some variation.

The preferred accommodation revenue variance is favourable to budget by \$42,000 (12.9%). This revenue is somewhat volatile and depends on bed availability in conjunction with patients' insurance coverage.

Chronic Co-payment revenue is under budget by 10,000 (13.3%). Patients designated as Alternate Level of Care (ALC) can be charged up to \$68.56 per day. This rate may be adjusted based on a co-payment assessment that takes into consideration the individual's income.

Patient Services revenue variance is \$507,000 favourable (2.5%) year to date. The largest contributor to this variance is diagnostic revenues that are \$394,000 higher than budget and are offset by an increase in medical staff remuneration of \$200,000. The remainder of the surplus is due to revenues for uninsured patients (non-OHIP).

Included in Patient Services revenue is OWN WSIB net revenue of \$210,000 year to date. This revenue is earned in diagnostic services and the operating room (charges for implants).

Equipment Grant amortization is under budget by \$49,000 (3.2%). Timing of equipment purchases and confirmation of any corresponding grants affects this revenue.

Other Recoveries are \$882,000 favourable (2.5%) to budget. \$818,000 of this surplus was incurred in the retail pharmacies and is offset by higher drug costs of \$469,000. The remaining surplus is due to Mohawk Medbuy rebates which were higher than budgeted.

Expenses

Salaries are under budget (favourable) by \$1,132,000 (0.7%) year to date September 30, 2025. Surpluses in Diagnostics, Critical Care and the Perioperative Program are related to vacancies and lower than planned volumes across these programs and are offset by deficits in Inpatient Medicine and the Emergency departments where surge conditions have necessitated additional staffing resources.

Employee Benefits are favourable to budget by \$325,000 (0.7%) and correlates to the wage surplus.

Employee Future Benefits are on budget.

Medical Staff Remuneration is over budget (unfavourable) by \$1,164,000 (3.8%). Emergency and NICU Alternate funding medical fees are over budget to date by \$720,000 and are offset by funding. Medical fees for diagnostic services are over budget by \$200,000 and have earned \$394,000 in additional patient services revenue. Pathology fees in the laboratory are \$66,000 over budget year to date in order to address backlogs.

Medical & Surgical Supplies are favourable to budget by \$627,000 (2.3%). The most significant surpluses were incurred in the perioperative program which is 579 cases below plan year to date.

Drug expenses are favourable by \$470,000 (.8%) year to date with surpluses in the chemotherapy program in ministry funded drugs (\$365,000 surplus), the critical care program (\$202,000 surplus) which has lower patient days than planned and the Emergency departments (\$83,000 surplus). As previously mentioned, the retail pharmacy drug deficit of \$469,000 is offset by favourable revenues of \$818,000.

Supplies and Other Expenses are unfavourable to budget by \$1,074,000 (2.4%). Significant variances are as follows:

- \$314,000 for invoices "on hold" by Mohawk Medbuy (as yet unassigned to a department)
- ♣ \$244,000 building service equipment
- \$222,000 physician recruitment costs
- \$189,000 referred out patient transportation
- \$135,000 contrast media supplies (used in diagnostic tests)

Long Term Interest expense is \$30,000 favourable (0.9%).

Equipment Lease/Rental is \$104,000 favourable (6.5%) to budget. These expenses vary based on bed rental utilization for bariatric patients or those with complex wounds.

Equipment amortization is \$16,000 (0.2%) under budget due to the timing of new asset additions.

Other Votes – Other Votes are on budget at September 30, 2025

2. Statement of Financial Position (Statement 3)

The Ministry/Ontario Health receivable has increased by \$12.7 million from March 31, 2025 and is due to timing differences for confirmed base and one-time funding.

Inventory has decreased by \$2,856,000 when compared to March 31, 2025. Pharmacy inventory adjustments will be reflected in the October 2025 financial statements based on the physical count at September 30, 2025.

Our Ministry/CCO payable has increased by \$2,984,000 from March 31, 2025 and is comprised mainly of amounts payable for unearned volume funding.

At September 30, 2025, the market value of the sinking fund has increased by \$12,114,000 (48.4%) since inception and increased by \$2,914,000 since March 31, 2025. The underlying cost base as a result of realized investment gains has increased by \$5,177,000 since the original \$25 million investment was made and increased by \$379,000 since March 31, 2025.

3. Patient Volumes

Acute patient days are below target at the Met Campus by 2,364 days and 597 greater than planned at the Ouellette Campus (excluding psychiatry). Adolescent psychiatry patient days attributed to the Met campus (Maryvale) are 433 less than plan while adult psychiatric days are 3,594 below plan at the Ouellette campus. Surgical cases are 441 below plan at the Met Campus and 138 cases below plan at the Ouellette Campus.

Combined ED visits are 1,322 higher than prior year-to date and ED inpatient days are 1,295 lower when compared to last year at this time. Outpatient Clinic visits are 857 below plan and Community Service visits are 403 above plan to date.

4. Patient Access

Acute care length of stay at Met was 4.93 days as compared to a target of 4.54 days. Length of stay for Ouellette acute care was 8.15 days versus a plan of 7.33. Length of stay for adult psychiatric patients was 1.99 days below the plan of 12.43 days and Maryvale (adolescent psychiatry) length of stay was 5.31 days compared to the target of 6.44.

5. Organizational Health

The percentage of sick time year to date for the Met Campus is 6.2%, which is over the target of 4.8% by 1.4%, while overtime is .40% above target at 4.4%.

Year to date sick time at the Ouellette Campus is 5.8% compared to the target of 4.8%, while overtime is over target the target of 4.0% at 6.6%.

Note that the sick and overtime metrics include unionized staff only.

With respect to FTEs, the Met Campus is favourable to budget by 16.5 FTEs. At the Ouellette Campus, the FTE variance is favourable by 12.2 FTEs. Overall, the hospital is favourable 28.6 FTEs year to date.
