1. CALL TO ORDER:

The meeting was called to order at 1700 hours with Mr. McLeod presiding as Chair and Ms. Sutherland recording the minutes.

2. DECLARATIONS OF CONFLICT OF INTEREST:

None declared.

3. PREVIOUS MINUTES:

The minutes of the June 5, 2025 Board meeting had been previously circulated.

4. REPORT FROM THE PRESIDENT & CEO / CNE

Ms. Riddell referred to her written report and provided the following highlights.

WRH has launched the autologous stem cell transplant program for patients of Windsor-Essex. This is a specialized form of cancer treatment where a patient's own stem cells are collected and then re-infused with other specialized medications to treat a range of blood-based cancers. The new program allows patients to receive this care here in their home community. Congratulations to all of our staff who have worked on this program.

A special announcement took place on August 14, 2025 confirming that the New Windsor/Essex Acute Care Hospital will be named The Fancsy Family Hospital, in recognition of a transformational gift of approximately \$40 million from the Estate of the late John Thomas Fancsy. This is the largest publicly known gift in the Windsor-Essex Region and is among one of the most generous known bequests ever made to a single organization in Canada.

Windsor Regional Hospital held a number of successful outdoor employee events this summer organized by its Healthy Workplace Committee including an outdoor guided circus play, Yin Yoga, Family Outing Essex Fun Fest and a Vet Tech Pet Walk and Talk. Each month we have a calendar of events throughout our community for employees and their families to enjoy.

Also in August, EllisDon was selected as the construction manager to lead the first phase of construction on the largest infrastructure investment in the region's history. They will oversee the Enabling Works construction which will include an Education and Administration Centre with an auditorium, simulation training centre, classrooms and office space for support staff and a multi-level parking garage that will connect to the new facility.

Over the next year, we will engage in a comprehensive renaming and rebranding process that will result in:

- A new corporate name
- A new logo that visually represents our identity and values
- A refreshed visual identity across including signage, printed materials, digital content, and uniforms to ensure a consistent, modern brand experience

Ms. Riddell provided a brief update with respect to Measles and ED wait times.

5. REPORT FROM SCHULICH:

Dr. Jacobs reported and provided some highlights:

- New school year 46 students starting in Windsor this year, 17th year.
- White Coat Ceremony was held last week and Dr. Velehorschi addressed the class.
- Welcoming Dean next week for meet and greet on Sept 10, 2025 at the Medical Education Building
- Dr. Alice Tsui has been named Assistant Dean Undergraduate Medical Education Curriculum of the medical school.
- For the residency programs, there are 19 residents, 4 Internal Medicine, 4 Psychiatry, and 11 family medicine.
- Starting discussions with the London campus to create Windsor Streams for Emergency Medicine.

6. FINANCIAL PRESENTATION (March 31, 2025 Results):

Mr. Lanoue reported.

Slide 2 – Financial Results – YTD July 2025

- The net deficit after building amortization is \$13,386,000 which is \$1,136,000 worse than budget
- Hospital Margin is negative \$10,826,000 which is \$1,525,000 worse than plan

Slide 4 – Significant Variances

Chart indicates expense variances and the offsetting revenue

- Salaries and Benefits have improved when compared to the previous month (June 2025) year to date
- Medical Staff Fees \$1,031,000 deficit
 - \$909,000 in offsetting funding (Emergency Alternate Funding) and patient services revenue for diagnostic services
 - o ICU med fees over budget & funding amounts, payments discontinued in July 2025
- Medical/Surgical Supplies minimal \$17,000 deficit
- Drugs \$124,000 deficit
 - Offset by \$650,000 revenue in retail pharmacies
- Other Supplies \$1,061,000 deficit no offsetting revenue
 - Pressure points: electricity, building and equipment maintenance, patient transportation and physician recruitment costs

Slide 5 – Sick and Overtime Benchmarks

Metric is Sick/Overtime Hours as a Percentage of Total Worked Hours

For the *month* of July – unionized staff

- Sick Percentage at both Campuses is above the target of 4.8% with Met at 6.6% and Ouellette at 5.4%
- Overtime Percentage at Met Campus is 4.7% and Ouellette is 7.0% versus the target of 4.0%. The target is higher than in the previous fiscal year as no overtime savings is included in the 2025-2026 budget

For the *month* of July – non-union staff


- Sick Percentage is 0.5% well below the target of 2.2%

Strategic Direction # 2- Foster an inclusive culture of accountability and transparency



The National Day for Truth and Reconciliation, originally and still colloquially known as Orange Shirt Day, is a Canadian day of memorial to recognize the atrocities and multigenerational effects of the Canadian Indian residential school system. It occurs every year on September 30.

Friday Sept 26th we gathered to honour the children who never returned home from Residential Schools, survivors of Residential Schools, their families and communities with a Sacred Fire. This gathering involved a traditional opening, lighting of the sacrec fire, teachings on the Sacred Fire and moments of personal reflection. Sacred Fires allow healing to take place and symbolizes the overall respect Indigenous Peoples have for their responsibility following the original instructions from the Creator. A Fire Keeper carefully attends to the fire and never leaves it. Sacred items may be present for teaching, and only indigenous medicines, such as traditional tobacco, sweet grass, sage, and cedar, are offered as offerings of prayer.

Tuesday, September 30 in addition to our staff wearing orange, we hosted a traditional dance and smudge ceremony to commemorate the day in the spirit of reconciliation in the Ouellette Campus Courtyard at 11 am.














Strategic Direction # 4- Enhance an equitable workplace culture that establishes WRH as an employer of choice

Corporate Renaming and Rebranding off to Strong Start

As Windsor Regional Hospital (WRH) continues to plan for a new hospital, with Phase one construction, the Enabling Works including an Education and Administration Centre and parking garage, expected to begin early in the new year. To align with the modern facility and the organization's evolving role in the community, the WRH is refreshing its corporate name and visual identity.

In September, we launched a renaming and rebranding survey inviting all staff, patients and community members to complete and have their say. Within the first week, more than 1000 participants have provided their input.

The survey will remain open until December 15, 2025. It is currently available in <u>French</u> and <u>English</u> on the project website, with additional translations coming soon. Paper copies of the online surveys are also available through the hospital's redevelopment office.










Sick Target 4.8%

5.0 NEW BUSINESS / FOR DISCUSSION

5.1 Monthly Operating Results Report – August 31, 2025 (As Appended)

Ms. Zimmer provided the following highlights:

- Five months ended August 31, 2025, the deficit after net building amortization amounts to \$13,934,000 (which is \$554,000 worse than plan). Represents a negative Ministry of Health Margin of \$10,735,000; one year ago, margin was negative \$10,340,000.

Highlights of significant variances (please see appended financial results for in-depth detail):

- Salaries and wages are positive year to date by \$911,000 (improvement since prior period year-to-date). Seeing some surpluses in critical care, diagnostics and perioperative program.
- Employee benefits are favourable to budget by \$261,000.
- Employee future benefits are on budget.
- Medical Staff Remuneration is over budget by \$1,132,000 (offset by increased patient services revenue and funding received for Emergency and NICU alternative funding payment programs.
- Medical and surgical supplies are favourable to budget by \$361,000 (improvement from prior year-to-date).
- Drug expenses are favourable to budget by \$447,000.
- Pharmacy has an efficiency initiative to improve their drug wastage and expired drugs (improved significantly). Year-to-date compared to budget is at a surplus of \$102,000.
- Supplies and other expenses are unfavourable to budget by \$1,093,000 (the significant variances are detailed in the appended financial results).
- Sick and overtime benchmarking for unionized staff both campuses are over target; sick target of 4.8% of worked hours with the Met Campus at 6.1% and 5.5% at Ouellette for the month.
- Overtime, seeing same trend. Target is 4% of worked hours. Ouellette Campus is at 7.8% for the month and Met at 5.1%.

- Non-union staff overtime is at 0 which is the target and sicktime is better than median target which is 2.28%.
- Volumes acute patient days slightly favourable. Mental health inpatient days are running below target by 10%.
- Outpatient clinic and community visits are close to target. Visits are up and trending well.

1. Financial Results for the Five Months ended August 31, 2025 (Statement 2)

For the five months ended August 31, 2025, the deficit after net building amortization is \$13,934,000, which is \$554,000 better than plan. This represents a negative Ministry of Health Margin of \$10,735,000 (one year ago, the margin was negative \$10,340,000).

Revenue

Ministry revenue (combined base and one-time) is \$641,000 (0.3%) lower than budget.

Base funding is under budget \$595,000 due to amounts repayable to the Ministry for volume-based programs in cardiology, neurology, quality-based procedures and the renal program which total \$1,215,000. This shortfall is offset by a funding surplus in Emergency and NICU Alternate funding of \$620,000. One time funding is under budget by \$46,000 in the Health and Human Resources (HHR) Nursing Extern Program as there were less extern hours paid than were budgeted. Revenue for this program is recognized to the amount of expenses incurred.

Ministry drug reimbursements have a negative variance of \$319,000 (1.5%). This revenue comes from the Cancer Centre's New Drug Funding program and the renal program. This budget is based on estimated drug usage and corresponding reimbursement and therefore there is some variation.

The preferred accommodation revenue variance is favourable to budget by \$49,000 (18%). This revenue is somewhat volatile and depends on bed availability in conjunction with patients' insurance coverage.

Chronic Co-payment revenue is surplus to the budget by 1,000 (1.6%). Patients designated as Alternate Level of Care (ALC) can be charged up to \$68.56 per day. This rate may be adjusted based on a co-payment assessment that takes into consideration the individual's income.

Patient Services revenue variance is \$165,000 favourable (1%) year to date. The largest contributor to this variance is diagnostic revenues that are \$410,000 higher than budget and are offset by an increase in medical staff remuneration of \$274,000.

Patient Services revenue includes "OWN WSIB" recoveries. Windsor Regional Hospital entered into a provider agreement with the Ottawa Hospital in October 2018. The hospital provides surgical services for WSIB clients that reside within the Essex and Chatham Kent counties. Surgical services for upper and lower extremities take place at both the Met and Ouellette campuses. OWN WSIB net revenue is \$165,000 year to date and is earned in diagnostic services and the operating room (charges for implants).

Equipment Grant amortization is under budget by \$48,000 (3.7%). Timing of equipment purchases and confirmation of any corresponding grants affects this revenue.

Other Recoveries are \$616,000 favourable (2.2%) to budget. This surplus was incurred in the retail pharmacies and is offset by higher drug costs of \$265,000.

Expenses

Salaries are under budget (favourable) by \$911,000 (0.7%) year to date August 31, 2025. Surpluses in Diagnostics, Critical Care and the Perioperative Program are offset by deficits in Inpatient Medicine and the Emergency departments.

Employee Benefits are favourable to budget by \$261,000 (0.7%) and correlates to the wage surplus.

Employee Future Benefits are on budget.

Medical Staff Remuneration is over budget (unfavourable) by \$1,132,000 (4.4%). Emergency and NICU Alternate funding medical fees are over budget to date by \$620,000 and are offset by funding. Medical fees for diagnostic services are over budget by \$274,000 and have earned \$410,000 in additional patient services revenue. Unfunded/unbudgeted ICU Med Fees are \$130,000 to date and these payments were discontinued in July 2025.

Medical & Surgical Supplies are favourable to budget by \$361,000 (1.6%). The most significant surpluses were incurred in the perioperative program which is 549 cases below plan year to date.

Drug expenses are favourable by \$447,000 (1%) year to date with surpluses in the chemotherapy program in ministry funded drugs (\$178,000 surplus), the critical care program (\$158,000 surplus) which has lower patient days than planned and the Emergency departments (\$73,000 surplus). The retail pharmacy drug deficit of \$265,000 is offset by favourable revenues of \$675,000. The pharmacy has implemented initiatives to decrease wastage and expired drugs which have resulted in a year to date budget surplus of \$103,000.

Supplies and Other Expenses are unfavourable to budget by \$1,093,000 (2.9%). Significant variances are as follows:

- \$318,000 building service equipment
- \$263,000 for invoices "on hold" by Mohawk Medbuy (as yet unassigned to a department
- \$182,000 physician recruitment costs
- \$145,000 utilities (electricity)
- \$106,000 contrast media supplies (used in diagnostic tests)
- \$130,000 referred out patient transportation

Long Term Interest expense is \$27,000 favourable (0.9%). Equipment Lease/Rental is \$2,000 unfavourable (.1%) to budget. These expenses vary based on bed rental utilization for bariatric patients or those with complex wounds.

Equipment amortization is \$478,000 (5.5%) under budget due to the timing of new asset additions.

Other Votes – Other Votes are \$6,000 favourable at August 31, 2025. The main source of this variance is the timing of revenue and expenses in certain funding envelopes. For most of these programs revenue is recognized to match expenses incurred.

2. Statement of Financial Position (Statement 3)

The Ministry/Ontario Health receivable has increased by \$17.7 million from March 31, 2025 and is due to timing differences for confirmed base and one-time funding.

Inventory has decreased by \$860,000 when compared to March 31, 2025.

Our Ministry/CCO payable has increased by \$1,908,000 from March 31, 2025 and is comprised mainly of amounts payable for unearned volume funding in the current year as well as funding confirmed after 2024-2025 year end that was not earned.

At August 31, 2025, the market value of the sinking fund has increased by \$11,460,000 (45.8%) since inception and increased by \$2,260,000 since March 31, 2025. The underlying cost base as a result of realized investment gains has increased by \$4,944,000 since the original \$25 million investment was made and increased by \$146,000 since March 31, 2025.

3. Patient Volumes

Acute patient days are below target at the Met Campus by 2,081 days and 600 greater than planned at the Ouellette Campus (excl. psych). Adolescent psychiatry patient days at the Met campus are 357 less than planned while adult psychiatric days are 2,880 below plan at the Ouellette campus. Surgical cases are 381 below plan at the Met Campus and 39 cases below plan at the Ouellette Campus.

Combined ED visits are 1,162 higher than prior year-to date and ED inpatient days are 997 lower when compared to last year at this time. Outpatient Clinic visits are 1,189 below plan and Community Service visits are 145 above plan to date.

4. Patient Access

Acute care length of stay at Met was 4.87 days as compared to a target of 4.54 days. Length of stay for Ouellette acute care was 8.14 days versus a plan of 7.33. Length of stay for adult psychiatric patients was 1.90 days below the plan of 12.43 days and Maryvale (adolescent psychiatry) length of stay was 5.43 days compared to the target of 6.44.

5. Organizational Health

The percentage of sick time year to date for the Met Campus is 6.2%, which is over the target of 4.8% by 1.4%, while overtime is .40% above target at 4.4%.

Year to date sick time at the Ouellette Campus is 5.6% compared to the target of 4.8%, while overtime is over target the target of 4.0% at 6.5%.

Note that the sick and overtime metrics include unionized staff only.

With respect to FTEs, the Met Campus is favourable to budget by 12.3 FTEs. At the Ouellette Campus, the FTE variance is favourable by 15 FTEs. Overall, the hospital is favourable 27.3 FTEs year to date.
