Ensure patients have timely access to fertility preservation information prior to cancer treatment to make an informed decision.



Epidemiology

- No therapy
- 34% of patients had premature ovarian insufficiency or amenorrhea
- 8.2% spontaneously conceive following chemotherapy
- Highly dependent on chemotherapy regimen, patient factors and age



What fertility preservation options are available for my AYA patients?

- Options for female patients include:
 - No therapy
 - GnRH agonist therapy
 - Oocyte cryopreservation
 - Embryo cryopreservation
 - Ovarian cortical tissue cryopreservation
- Options for male patients include:
 - No therapy
 - Sperm freezing



What else should I consider?



- Health care providers should initiate the discussion on the possibility of infertility with patients with cancer treated during their reproductive years or with parents/guardians of children as early as possible
- A Fertility Specialist needs at least 1-2 weeks to provide most fertility preservation options
- No pre-treatment testing is required from you prior to making a referral to a Fertility Specialist
 - The Victory Reproductive Care team prefer to perform all necessary tests on site

Approximate Costs

- The Government of Ontario offers a program that provides funding to participating fertility clinics across the province to cover treatment costs for eligible residents
- The cost of fertility services vary. For that reason the costs listed below are approximate.

Fertility Services for Men	Cost	Fertility Services for Women	Cost
Sperm banking	\$600	Egg/embryo freezing procedure	\$5,000
Additional sperm sample	\$200	Hormone medication	\$2,000
Sperm storage fee (yearly)	\$300	Egg/embryo storage fee (yearly)	\$500
In vitro fertilization	\$7,000	In vitro fertilization	\$7,000
Intrauterine insemination	\$400	Ovarian cortical cryopreservation	\$2,000
