

What is lymphedema?

Lymphedema is swelling that is caused by a large amount of lymph fluid in the tissues. This swelling can be the result of a tumor, surgery, or radiation.



How do I manage my symptoms of lymphedema?

One of the most effective ways to manage your swelling is through the use of compression garments. A compression garment of a sleeve, glove, vest, and/or bra is recommended when the swelling stays the same for a period of time. To begin the process of getting a compression garment, you can ask your care team about your options, including financial assistance.

Financial Assistance

Assistive Devices Program (ADP):

of your compression garment or sleeve may be be covered by the Assistive Devices Program (ADP) of the Ministry of Health and Long Term Care (MOHLTC), which provides funding assistance for compression garments and sleeves for chronic lymphedema management. The paperwork for this Government assistance can be filled out for your in the clinic. You would then take the Assistive Devices Program (ADP) form to your registered fitter. This Government program supports 75% of cost. These garments cost between \$300 - \$400 per set. Please see pages 4-6 for detailed steps to begin the ADP application process. Steps for Completing the ADP Form

Applying for coverage through ADP is a 3-step process.

Step #1:

Please have your specialist (Oncologist, Vascular Surgeon, Internal Medicine etc.) fill out the following:

- 1) Page 2, Section 2:
 - Chronic Lymphedema: Primary or Secondary
 *Must be filled out funding is only for patients with lymphedema
 - Surgical Procedure (if applicable)
 - Date of Surgery (if applicable)
- 2) Page 6, Section 4:
 - Physician info and signature

<u>Step #2</u>

You will then bring this form to an ADP Authorizer for Pressure Modification Devices to fill out the following:

- 1) Page 3-4 Section 2b and
- 2) Page 6, Authorizer Info and signature

Step #3

Upon completion of Step #1 and #2 you are now ready to be measured and fitted for your garment.

Other Ways You Can Help With Your Lymphedema

Therapist that are qualified to treat lymphedema must have specialized training in Combined Decongestive Therapy (CDT). Along with CDT therapists, some Registered Massage Therapists (RMT) are also able to perform Manual Lymph Drainage (MLD) which involves a gentle massage that helps move fluid from swollen areas of the body to areas with healthy lymph vessels. *Speak to your care team to see if MLD is the right option for you.

Definitions

- ADP: Assistive Devices Program
- CDT: Combined Decongestive Therapy
- RMT: Registered Massage Therapist
- MLD: Manual Lymph Drainage
- Compression Garment: A tight-fitting, elastic garment, such as a sleeve or stocking to assist with minimizing lymphedema
- Compression Garment Fitter: A compression garment fitter specialist is a licensed professional who measures, fits, and selects compression garments for patients
