

Join Town Halls

At each of the 11 Virtual Town Halls. members of the public will hear from the hospital leaders, doctors and patient representatives who've been involved in the planning process to date as part of our 40+ User Groups. Each event will focus on a different department of the hospital, and community members are invited to register for and join any or all of the virtual events. They will take place during the last two weeks of March and first week of April.

Here's what else we've been up to:



Second round of User Group planning meetings

The 40+ User Groups made up of hospital leaders, frontline staff and patient & community representatives have started their second round of meetings on the Functional Program planning for all areas of the hospital. In Round 2, the groups have the opportunity to review a first draft of the Functional Program for their areas.

Each group — representing a different program and service in the hospital — will meet 3-4 times between January and June as members work closely with Agnew Peckham Health Care Planning Consultants to develop the Functional Program to guide the development of "block schematic designs" of the hospital in the second half of this year.

'Well on our way'

The PMO team was invited to attend the February 16 meeting of Essex County Council to provide an update on the project timeline.

At the conclusion of the presentation, Warden Gary McNamara said councillors are looking forward to getting shovels in the ground and reiterated the County's support for the project.

"The County has been unanimous, and I mean unanimous... in their support. We are well on our way to providing our commitment and will continue to do so," he said, referencing the County's commitment to cover 46 per cent or \$91.5 million of the local share.

The City of Windsor has agreed to cover the remaining 54 per cent of the \$200 million local share.


Request for Proposals

The PMO is now working closely with Infrastructure Ontario and the Ministry of Health to prepare a public **Request for Proposals** (**RFP**) for a Planning Design and Conformance (PDC) Team of architects and engineers to develop the Block Schematic Drawings necessary as Part B of the Stage 2 planning phase.

The contract is for the full life cycle of the Project, from now until the end of construction of the new hospital.

The RFP process is highly structured and co-ordinated by Infrastructure Ontario, the procurement agency of the Province of Ontario, that oversees procurement processes for major social and transportation infrastructure projects.

"We will be onboarding the PDC this summer, and the architects and engineers will use the completed functional program to inform the development of block schematic drawings — department layouts, arrangement of departments horizontally and vertically according to required operating adjacencies and public and staff circulation corridors, all culminating into a preliminary master building plan and master site plan that will guide the design of the hospital moving into subsequent phases of design development," Landry said.
