Early Plans for the Ouellette Campus Demonstrate a Continued Commitment to Care in the Core

While ongoing work with the Ministry of Health to finalize the scope of the New Windsor/Essex Acute Care Hospital continues, the project hit another planning milestone this month with the submission of a Stage 1.3 (formerly Stage 2) plan for the Ouellette Campus. The submission includes the proposed scope of services to be provided at the downtown Windsor location after a new state-of-the-art hospital opens on County Rd. 42 and the 9th Concession, as well as an implementation plan to ensure uninterrupted services throughout the redevelopment process.

The submission complements the planning work being done for the New Windsor/Essex Acute Care Hospital and is the result of extensive collaboration with many partners within the hospital, the community, and the province. It includes a functional program, a set of block diagrams.

Windsor Regional Hospital President and CEO David Musyj says the plan highlights the hospital's commitment to ensuring patients in Windsor-Essex receive timely and accessible care close to home after the new hospital opens.

"Residents in downtown Windsor will have access to urgent care services close to home, at a hospital-run urgent care centre where they will be treated by the same emergency-trained staff and physicians

who work at the Emergency Department in the new acute care hospital," Musyj says. "In addition, patients will have access to medical tests, treatments, lab work and a variety of out-patient services at the Ouellette location."

The plan was submitted to the Ministry of Health after receiving endorsement from the WRH Board of Directors.

Highlights include:

- An Urgent Care Centre that will operate 24/7
- Diagnostic Imaging
- Laboratory
- Pharmacy Services
- Medical Daycare
- Outpatient Services
- Administrative Services

Renal Dialysis will continue to be offered to patients in the Bell Building, which is also located on the Ouellette site.

Expert hospital planners and architects developed the plan for Ouellette in consultation with eight User Groups representing all programs and services that will be offered at the site. The User Groups were made up of hospital leadership, staff, professional staff, volunteers and patient and community representatives - including members of

the hospital's Patient and Family Advisory Committee and the Chief of the Essex-Windsor Emergency Medical Services.

The submission is based on current and future projected patient volumes. It is designed to complement the services that will be offered at the new hospital site and incorporates the extensive community feedback received throughout the new hospital planning.

Brandon Bailey, Vice President of Redevelopment, says minimizing redevelopment costs by maximizing the reuse of good infrastructure in the existing facility was a priority.

"While much of the current infrastructure is between 70 and 90 years old, there was investment in the Diagnostic and Treatment area in 2001," said Bailey. "This submission represents a team effort to look at ways to make use of the existing infrastructure, as directed, wherever possible, while still ensuring a quality facility that meets modern hospital building standards and supports a safe patient experience."

The Ministry of Health Capital Branch will now review the submission and work with the hospital to ensure the final approved plan - together with the final plan for the new hospital - aligns with provincial expectations and appropriately meets the needs of patients in Windsor-Essex.

Early plans for the New Windsor/Essex Acute Care Hospital were submitted to the Ministry in April of this year and WRH is on track to meet the timeline confirmed in Infrastructure Ontario's latest Market Update that has the tendering process set to begin in 2025 and "shovels in the ground" by 2026.

Easing stress with comfort and convenience

Earlier this month in a series of focus groups, hospital staff, professional staff, volunteers, and community representatives, were invited to discuss the types of services and amenities they feel could make time spent at the hospital a little less stressful.

J.C. Williams Group led the discussions as part of their work developing an Ancillary Services Strategy for the new hospital.

Throughout the sessions, common themes emerged including:

- the need for late-night refreshments in the 24/7 facility,
- healthy, affordable, and diverse food options that support special diets and cultural needs.
- a place to purchase items left at home, like a toothbrush, phone charger or clean socks, and
- grab-and-go and delivery options for staff who have limited time to step away and family members who do not want to leave the bedside.

Ancillary Services Focus Group Insights
